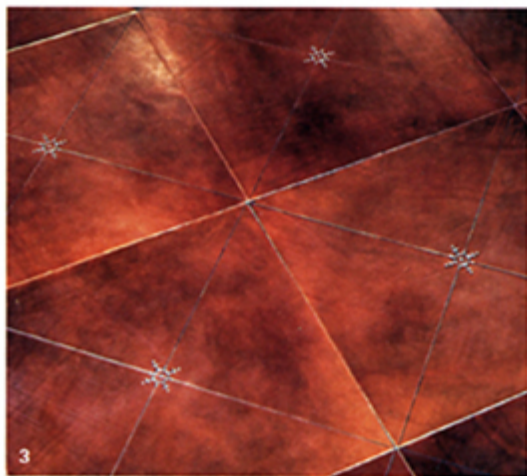

# Baroque is back

Updated to reflect a global melting pot, the bold style is hotter than ever



**1** Part of the Jules Verne Collection from Murray Feiss, this traditional brulee gold and antique brass upright chandelier, \$377, adds an exotic touch to a room with its cable support structure and tassel detail.

**2** Ornately hand-carved out of rare, antique hardwoods reclaimed from abandoned Brazilian estates, Brazil Baroque's California king-size

Baroque Bed, \$22,000, has a commanding presence, measuring 84 inches high.

**3** Designed by Cowden Bell for Ann Sacks, the Cowden Bell Collection of Herman Oak leather floor and wall tiles, each hand-dyed and hand-stamped, is available in three patterns and seven colorways. Pricing starts at \$62 per square foot.

**4** Inspired by Indian forehead jewelry, Bindi by Donghia, \$140 per yard, is woven of polyester and linen and has a sheen and slub effect similar to silk shantung.

**5** The Venetian Console, \$12,350, from Manheim-Ruseau is made of carved basswood with a 22-carat gold leaf applied on top of antique gesso. It's available to architects and interior designers through John Rosselli & Associates.
